Shire of Dalwallinu 2023 Asset Inspections have commenced

The Shire commenced asset inspections from Monday 29 May 2023. Professional inspectors from Talis Consultants have been engaged by the Shire in accordance with government reporting requirements to assess and value the roads, drains, paths and other infrastructure. The inspection vehicle may be seen around the Shire.

Inspections of assets provides several useful benefits – (i)check the condition of roads, (ii) comply with government reporting requirements, (iii) identify asset maintenance needs, (iv) support planning and grant funding.

The new Early Childhood Learning Centre building will be ready for occupation in the coming weeks.

Stage 2 will then be undertaken by the contractors which will be the demolition of the existing building and construction of the carpark and fencing. The Shire is currently undertaking the landscaping works.

The new nine (9) lot Industrial subdivision being undertaken by DevelopmentWA recently received approval from the WA Planning Commission. This will now enable DevelopmentWA to seek contractors for the construction of both the residential and industrial subdivisions in the coming months.

With lack of housing and land being on the top of our agenda, the Shire recently submitted an application to DevelopmentWA to release six (6) vacant lots on Rolinson Drive Kalannie. In addition, Council have been considering a proposal to undertake further residential subdivisions in the Dalwallinu townsite, if the land can be acquired from the State Government.

CEO Chit Chat

The first tranche of the local government reforms were passed by the State Government on 11 May 2023.

The electoral reforms are aimed at strengthening local democracy, transparency and accountability by:

- Introducing optional preferential voting, bringing local government elections back in line with State and Federal elections and restoring the right of electors to express preferences;
- Requiring public election of the mayor or president for all larger councils;
- Abolishing the use of wards for smaller local governments;
- Aligning the size of council with the size of the population of each local government area;
- Enabling reforms to the owners and occupiers roll to prevent the use of 'sham leases', addressing critical findings of the Inquiry into the City of Perth;
- Setting state-wide caretaker periods during ordinary council elections.

This month we farewell Joanne Jones, our Economic and Community Development Officer. Jo has worked with us for nearly six (6) years and has been involved in some very exciting projects namely the Recreation Centre and Community Hub redevelopment. We wish both her and Kevin all the best for the future.

We also say farewell to our Grader Driver, Ted Richards who after nineteen (19) years with the Shire is retiring on 30 June 2023. We wish him all the best.




Report It Function on the Shire Website

As completion grows closer works are now commencing on the signage and outside areas. The bathrooms have been completed and are full of vibrant colours for the users.




