Petrudor Rocks – This is a great hotspot to check out this season. The rain has filled the rock pools and the entire location is green and gold. There isn't too many orchid sightings as we move into the later time in the season but there is still the full carpets of everlastings outlining the edge of the rock formations.



When exploring this area, we strongly advise you to watch your step near the wet rocks as they can be slippery.



Dalwallinu Shire September 2024 Wildflower Report



Wubin Rocks – There is small patches of the everlasting carpets scattered through out this area. The wattle trees are full of colour which only adds to the scenery at Wubin Rocks. Located only 27kms north-east of Dalwallinu, this spot is also a free self-sufficient camp.

In the Wubin town, there is the **Wubin Museum**. The Volunteers and community that have put this together have done an amazing job preserving and displaying the shires history.



The Old Well – Located here in the town of Dalwallinu, the Old Well is good little historical sight with a handful of little tracks going throughout some bushland that is home to bee orchids, donkey orchids, waitzia, wattle and everlastings which are all in bloom.

Shire maps are free and available to help guide you through. These can be collected from the Discovery Centre.



Buntine Rocks – Another location that is good for a overnight stay, picnic or scenic walk. The road to Buntine is good for any vehicle. There is a sign that indicates “no caravans past this point” and from then onwards it is advised that AWD or 4WD are the only vehicles to go on.

Mia Moon – This location is home to bee orchids, donkey orchids, sun orchids, sundews or rainbows, narrow leaf squill, wattle and carpets of everlastings.

Mia Moon can either be a self-guided drive or walk through on tracks there. The land there is covered in colour. This is also a self sufficient camp site. Please ensure that you take your rubbish away with you. The shire provides free biodegradable bags that you can take with you and help Keep Australia Beautiful. These bags can be collected from the Dalwallinu Discovery Centre.

Wildflowers at Mia Moon can be found on both sides of the road but the better bunch of orchids and flowers to see will be located on the left side of the road if you’re travelling west on Nugadong West Road.

Jibberding Reserve – Travelling north on the Great Northern Highway, located only 43kms out of town, Jibberding Reserve has an abundance of everlastings. As far as the eye can see, there is a rainbow of everlastings.

Jibberding Reserve can either be a self-guided drive or walk through on tracks there. The land there is covered in colour. This is also a self sufficient camp site.



Wasley Road – Home to our BLOOMING wreath flowers. There is currently 7+ wreath flowers located a couple kms up the road ready for you to take their picture.
