Mrs Batterham nominated the project with AGT and the Shire were successful with the \$20,000 donation.

## New Cherry Picker

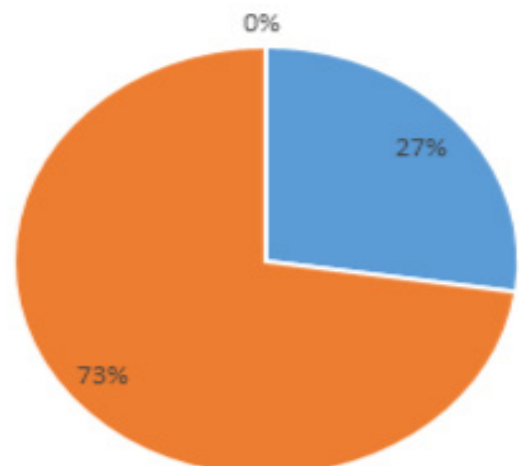
The Shire recently took delivery of its new cherry picker. This will allow staff much safer access to a multitude of jobs.

## Local Talent a finalist in Song of the Year for West Australian Music (WAM)

The 2022 nominee pool for WAM Song of the Year features an exciting mix of locally-acclaimed and emerging artists. Dalwallinu's own Codie Sundstrom is a finalist again this year. Codie previously featured as a finalist in 2012 when at only 17 years of age her song 'Heart of a Lion' took out the Regional Category. In 2013 she earned two nominations for her song 'The Darkness'. This year she has been nominated again in the POP Category with her song 'Let You In' which she released under the name Klaude.

With over 1,200 original songs entered from artists across the state, WA's premier songwriting competition is primed to showcase the emerging and established songwriting talent born from our very own backyard. Judged by a pool of over 60 independent international, national and local industry judges, the annual competition provides a rare opportunity for songwriters of all genres, ages and levels to have their music heard by industry professionals.

Codie self-released her first acoustic demo at just 15 years of age and her music career has

progressed remarkably well since that time. She has played alongside established bands in Perth and has been involved with a variety of WA festivals. Codie is also a part of Music Feedback, a program funded by the WA Mental Health Commission that aims to reduce stigma around mental health with the message "Music talks about mental health. So can you."

Her 2013 song 'The Darkness' was about mental illness. "It's a question to the World" she stated. "Mental illnesses like depression and anxiety still go largely under the radar in our society. I guess it's posing the question, what are we really teaching our kids? They know how to solve complex algebraic equations, yet when faced with all the stress our daily lives include they have no idea where or how to express the need for support. There's something wrong there I think."

Codie's relaxed sound could be described as folk-tinged, but said she didn't like to generalise about her music. "I love my blues and rock, but I'm also enjoying a lot of electronic music at the moment so who knows where it'll go."



The winners will be revealed at the awards event in September, where they'll be taking home a share in \$45,000 worth of prizes, and joining the star-studded ranks of previous winners. We wish Codie all the best.

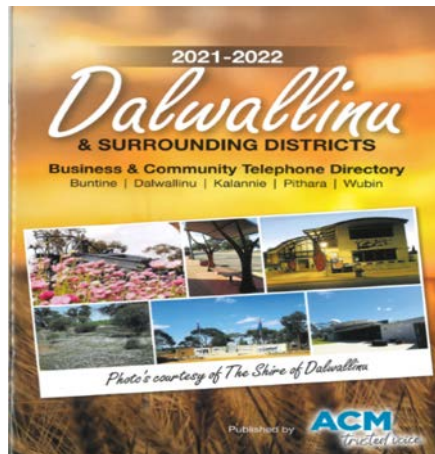

## Library on Wheels

Every fortnight, the Dalwallinu library hits the road to deliver library books to people who are unable to attend the library in person.

The service operates every second Tuesday and goes to the hospital, Acacia House, Pioneer House and private homes in Dalwallinu for a collection of avid readers who have eclectic tastes ranging from thrillers, romance and family sagas to history, biographies and stories about animals.

The books are available in formats from large print to audio books and normal print. It keeps us on our toes trying to find new materials for people who consume books in the way other people consume food and is the highlight of Jo's week when she succeeds.

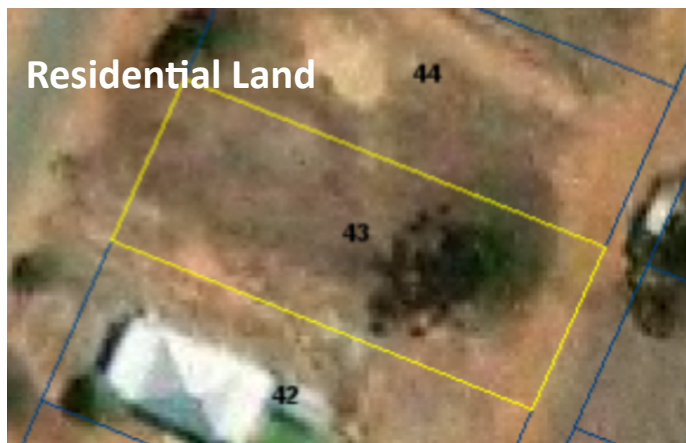

### Proposed Land Development

We are pleased to advise that the Shire of Dalwallinu has been successful with its applications under the Regional Development Assistance Program (RDAP) for development of Dalwallinu Residential Stage 3 and Dalwallinu Light Industrial Area Stage 2.

The DevelopmentWA Board undertook a thorough review of both applications and we are thrilled to hear that both of our applications have been successful.

Dalwallinu Residential Stage 3 will be an extension of the development previously undertaken on Gamenya Place, Dalwallinu and it is proposed that this will be nine (9) residential lots ranging in size from 542<sup>m</sup><sup>2</sup> to 1,282<sup>m</sup><sup>2</sup>.

Dalwallinu Light Industrial Area Stage 2 will be an extension of the existing industrial area to the south. This is proposed to be eight (8) lots ranging in size from 4,681<sup>m</sup><sup>2</sup> to 1.07ha.

There are several steps to be undertaken in the lead up to the works commencing and it is expected that should the tenders received align with available RDAP funds, the works will commence in the 2023-2024 financial year.
