The construction of the new Multi-Purpose Early Childhood Learning Centre in McNeill Street is coming along well. The footings were poured at the end of October and the structural steel will be up mid-November. We are still on track at this stage for completion at the end of June 2023.

Works have commenced on the Annetts Rd upgrade. These

We continue our selection of interviews with long standing members of our community. This month our reflection features the late Mr Ernie Carlshausen & Mrs Thelma Carlshausen.

Ernie and Thelma Carlshausen

Thelma Carlshausen (nee Cail) was born in Perth. Thelma grew up at Jibberding on Cail Road. They lived in a wheat bag house lined with hessian and covered with wallpaper. Most other houses were mudbrick. She grew up with one brother who was 3 years older. The farm she grew up on was one of the original settled in the area from the four Cail brothers who came to Jibberding from



and established Victoria themselves in the area. Her ancestors were the first land clearers in the Jibberding local area.

Thelma attended Cailbro School which catered for infants of 6 years old up to 14 years. It was too far to walk and they attended by using the horse and cart. The last two years she spent doing correspondence. Once Thelma left school she helped out at home before working in the Bakers shop in Wubin. She left work when she was married at twenty one years of age.

Ernest (Ernie) Carlshausen was also born in Perth. As with Thelma his family were from Jibberding. Ernie grew up with two brothers and two sisters. Ernie attended East Wubin School where there was an enrolment of just eight students. In those days the students travelled by horse and cart to get to school. He finished



schooling by attending boarding school in New Norcia for the last two years.

It was a journey in itself to get to school. He would travel by train to Perth and then bus back up to New Norcia and do the same by reverse when he went home for holidays. When Ernie left school he returned home to the farm at Jibberding. His father died when Ernie was young and he and his mother and brothers had to work the



Ernie and Thelma did not really get to know each other growing up. Even though they were both from the Jibberding area and saw each other at dances and picnics they only officially met when Thelma became friends with one of Ernie's There were many sisters. dances and Debutante Balls in those days as far spread as Latham to Ballidu.

and Ernie Thelma were married on the 23 August 1952 when Thelma was twenty one. They eventually moved onto their farm at Wubin where they settled and had four children.



Ron, Linda, Glenda and Julie. Ron who took over the farm but is now semi-retired. The farm is run by his two sons and families. Linda trained as a nurse farmed locally before retiring to Denmark. Julie lives in Harvey but loves nothing more than coming home to Dally to enjoy the open spaces. Glenda works at the bank here in Dalwallinu. At last count they have 13 grandchildren and 27 great grandchildren. The greatest joy of Thelma's life is her family.



When Glenda was in school she announced to her parents she wanted to apply for an American Field Scholarship. This meant Glenda would live and go to school in America for a year. The criteria for the selection process was quite Thelma rigorous. recalls having to host members of the judging panel at their farm so they could assess Glenda and her family. They arrived in the middle of shearing and basically had to work around the farm requirements and it was this that clinched the deal. Glenda was selected and she headed off to America.

She was very lucky to be placed with a wonderful family in Missouri on their farm. Shirley and Marven Oerke adopted Glenda and she became part of their family, and remains so to this day. Ernie and Thelma travelled to America for a month and stayed on the Oerke farm with the family with Thelma visiting a further six times since. The families have shared many celebrations including several of the children's weddings



They remain lifelong friends which is a wonderful tribute to them all

Travel has became a big part of Thelma's life since losing Ernie. Apart from travelling to America and Borneo she has gone on many cruises with family members. She has cruised from Fremantle to Darwin and then boarded the Ghan for the train trip to Adelaide. She also cruised from Cairns to Papua New Guinea and onto Sydney, as well as Broome to Darwin and on to Cairns. She has also cruised through Alaska.

She's been on the Indian Pacific no less than seven times and because of lawn bowls has travelled to Norfolk Island, Tasmania and South Australia. One of the trips that remains an absolute highlight with Thelma is travelling the Canning Stock Route with one of her granddaughters and her future husband.

Her other interests include being a member of the Wubin CWA, Tennis club, Golf Club where she won the B-Grade She volunteered with once. Meals-on-Wheels and is a member of the Craft Shop.

Thelma moved to Dalwallinu in 1977. She never wanted to live in a city and loves the country, her home and her family. Her home is full of family photos and photo albums and the fridge is covered with grandchildren and great grandchildren's photos.

When I asked if she would change anything or bring anything to Dally, her answer was an emphatic "Nothing".

She is a massive Essendon fan and can name every player and also still regularly attends local games when they are played in Dalwallinu to support her family when they are playing.

I asked about one thing she grew up with that youngsters wouldn't understand or even remember today and Thelma's response was the lack of available water and not being able to bath or shower daily.

We thank Thelma for sharing their story with us.

Dalwallinu Town Hall

The Dalwallinu Town Hall has been on Council's agenda since 1978 when the first consultant was engaged to determine the problem areas. Some remediation work has been undertaken over the years.

More recently a survey was conducted in June 2022 and a well-attended public meeting was held in July 2022. From both the survey results and the public meeting, it was evident that the community wanted to retain the Dalwallinu Town Hall.

I am pleased to advise that Council have agreed to 'Retain and Maintain' the Dalwallinu Town Hall. The works will be carried out as two (2) Projects.

Project 1 - will be the demolition of the rear of the building that houses the public amenities and backstage dressing room. The benefits of this will be less maintenance costs, less of a visual eyesore as that section of the building is redundant and it will create additional car parking spaces in close proximity to the CBD.

Project 2 - will be the removal the existing flooring and replace with concrete and install timber flooring to the main area of the hall with vinyl in the two front rooms.

At the Ordinary Council Meeting held 25 October 2022, Council awarded Project 1 to Brajkovich Demolition. These works will commence shortly.

Officers will then proceed with sourcing quotes for Project 2.

Council would like to thank the community for their input into the survey and their attendance at the public meeting.

Council believe that this is an acceptable outcome for the future of the Dalwallinu Town Hall and are pleased to finally conclude this matter.





You do need to be a financial member of the gym to utilise the gym and use the equipment.



PROPOSED REVOCATION OF PLANNING POLICY No 1

The Shire proposes to revoke *Planning Policy N* $^{\circ}$ 1 – *Offensive Uses* after a considered review of said Planning Policy.

The objective of planning policy N° 1 is to:

Oppose any development involving an offensive use that it considers will unduly affect the continued operation of an existing use within the Shire.

It has been determined that the Planning Policy is redundant as it is no longer suitable and needs to be revoked in its entirety for the reasons that:

- The Policy does not relate to the overarching legislation and is found to be redundant in necessity.
- Offensive Trades are already adequately provided for within the enabling legislation Health (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1911.
- This Policy's objective is very subjective in its nature and tends to override the authority of Council in its deliberations as a planning authority.

REVIEW OF SYSTEM OF REPRESENTATION

How to avoid being bitten


- At home screen all doors and windows, doors should be self-opening and open outwards
- When camping screen caravans, tents, swags and other sleeping equipment
- Wear long, loose fitting and preferably light-coloured clothing
- Use repellents containing DEET (diethyl toluamide) or Picaridin
- Recognise and avoid areas of mosquito activity such as swamps, marshes, billabongs and rivers floodplains

How to eliminate Mosquito Breeding in Your Backyard

You can take simple steps to help eliminate mosquito breeding in the community and you can do this by starting in your own backyard. Some of the things that you can do to help eliminate mosquto breeding include;

- Dispose of all containers which hold water
- Keep ornamental ponds stocked with mosquito eating fish eg goldfish
- Keep swimming pools well chlorinated and filtered and free of dead leaves
- Fill or drain depressions in the ground that hold water
- Fit mosquito proof cowls to vent pipes on septic tank systems. Seal all gaps in septic tank lids and ensure that leach drains are completed covered
- Screen rainwater tanks with insect proof mesh, including inlet, overflow and inspection ports
- Ensure guttering does not hold water



Fire Danger Ratings describe the potential level of danger should a bushfire start. They provide important information so you can take action to protect yourself and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of a bushfire. You need to understand the Fire Danger Rating to assess your level of bushfire risk and decide what actions to take.

The new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) levels are:

Moderate: Plan and prepare.

Most fires can be controlled. Stay up to date and be alert for fires in your area.

High: Be ready to act.

Fires can be dangerous. Decide what you will do if a fire starts. Leave bushfire risk areas if necessary.

Extreme: Take action now to protect your life and property.

Fires will spread quickly and be extremely dangerous. Put your bushfire plan into action. If you and your property are not prepared to the highest level, plan to leave early.

Catastrophic: For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.

These are the most dangerous conditions for a fire. Homes cannot withstand fires in these conditions and if a fire starts and takes hold, lives are likely to be lost. Stay safe by going to a safer location early in the morning or the night before.

When there is minimal risk, Fire Danger Ratings will be set to 'No Rating'. On these days you still need to remain alert and abide by local seasonal laws and regulations.
