
















SHIRE PRESIDENT Keith Carter

The Shire of Dalwallinu have recently upgraded some of the equipment in the gymnasium. Only one new elliptical machine has been installed with an extra treadmill replacing the second elliptical. The treadmills are constantly in use and the ellipticals were not used as much. The bike and rowing machines were also replaced. 




